School trip to Mantua Students from our Form, 3AB, are discovering their own town



Mantua- on 13th December 2012, on a cold market day.

We are students at a Catering and Hospitality School in Gazoldo, a little town 15 km from Mantua. Today we are discovering elements of art and architecture typical of Mantuan palaces and churches.





St. Andrew's Basilica

We set off with a good breakfast, a souvenir photo and ... some gossip (we are friends, after all!). St. Andrew's Basilica is the start of our visit, the biggest of Mantuan churches, designed by Leon Battista Alberti. The external structure is peculiar, with its many arches on the front.



After that, we move on to **Piazza Erbe** (which means "the square for spices and herbs"). The **Rotonda di San Lorenzo** is our next stop. "Rotonda" means "round" and it refers to the round form of this church, built in Romanesque style. The nearby **Torre dell'Orologio** (clock tower) has very special minute and second hands.





Then, Teatro Bibiena: striking, indeed, in many different ways. First of all, the plate with the name of Mozart, who played here when he was still a boy.





The bell-shaped little interior, so cosy, with its many lights and the perfect acoustics makes us feel proud of being here.





Our next visit is **Piazza Sordello**, in front of the Ducal Palace. Sordello was a Medieval bard, also celebrated by Dante in the "Divine Comedy".

The wonderful and majestic **Castello di San Giorgio** (St. George's Castle) is our last stop. Unfortunately, it is too big for a detailed visit, so we only admire the

external structure.


A town surrounded by lakes

The three lakes around Mantua are an important water resource and, in the past, they were also a line of communication. Today they are a place for fun and sports, such as canoeing. The flora and fauna are rich, especially in July and August, when water lilies are in full blossom. But there is also the other side of the coin: in the summer, the water of the lakes gives origin to lots of humidity as well as to very annoying mosquitos.
